Saints Let First Place Opportunity Slip Away

The Saints hoped to finish the weekend in first place in the Jayhawk West with a series win over first place Butler. But the Saints will settle for a three way tie for second after splitting Saturday and Sunday. Saturday, the Grizzlies won game one 8-4 after the Saints allowed six unearned runs. The Saints won the second game Saturday 7-5 after Luke Campbell's two RBI hit in the bottom of the fifth broke a 5-5 tie. Corey Collins pitched five and one third innings for the win (5-0). Travis Parker nailed down the save. Sunday, Perryton's Austin Terhune pitched six innings striking out four and walking one for the win (2-1).
