

Voter Registration Deadline Approaches In Texas County

Friday, 18th January, is the last day to apply for

voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the 12th February Goodwell I-60, Texhoma I-61 and Turpin I-128 Annual School Board Elections, Texas County Election Board Secretary La Fonda F. Limon said today.

Persons that will appear on the Ballots in Texas County are as follows:

? For Goodwell I-60 School Board Position number Three (3) a Five (5) year Term, the candidates are:

o Roger Edenborough

o Russell Guthrie

? For Texhoma I-61 School Board Position number Three (3) a Five (5) year Term, the candidates are:

o Roger E. Powers

o Kenneth C. Allard

? For Turpin I-128 School Board Position number Three (3) a Five (5) year Term, the candidates are:

o John Mose

o David Ratzlaff

? And the candidates for Turpin I-128 School Board Position number Five (5) a Two (2) year Term, the candidates are:

o Timothy Thornton

o Aaron Levins

Limon said that persons who are United States citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 18 years old may apply to become registered voters.

Persons who have never been registered to vote before or who are not currently registered in the county of their residence and persons who are registered but who need to

change their registration information may apply by filling out and mailing an Oklahoma Voter Registration Application form in time for it to be postmarked no later than midnight Friday, 18th January.

Limon said that applications postmarked after that time still will be accepted and processed, but the applications will not be approved until after 12th February 2013.

The County Election Board responds in writing to every person who submits an application for voter registration. The response is either a Voter Identification Card listing the new voter's precinct number and polling place location or a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application for voter registration was not approved. Limon said that any person who has submitted a voter registration application and who has not received a response within 30 days should contact the County Election Board office.

Oklahoma Voter Registration Application forms are available at the County Election Board office located at 301 N. Main St. (Courthouse Annex) in Guymon, OK, and at most post offices, tag agencies, and public libraries in the county. Limon said that applications also are available on the Internet at www.elections.ok.gov.
