Kansas will salute the top community college scholars for their academic accomplishments in an award two from Seward County Community College/Area Technical School in Liberal, Kansas.

Representing SCCC/ATS are Jose Covarrubias and Azucena Juarez.

Covarrubias of Liberal is a sophomore majoring in pharmacy, who plans to transfer to Southwestern Ok

Each is also a nominee for the 2014 All-USA Community College Academic Team, sponsored by the Phi Theta Kappa International Honor Society, the Kansas Association of Community Colleges and the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation.

Phi Theta Kappa is the honor society for students attending community and two-year colleges. It is based on averages and other criteria, with members focusing on scholastic achievement and service to community.

Each student will receive a proclamation issued by the governor of Kansas, an educational stipend
